Cloverbuds can participate by picking up a pre-sewn throw pillow at the OSU Extension office with their entry. Cloverbuds will use their creativity to design a fun pillow to model during the contest. There are no guidelines to how the pillow can be decorated. A small stitch will be left open for cloverbuds to stuff the pillow and are encouraged to try to hand-sew their pillow shut with the help of an adult.

All participants will receive a \$3 voucher premium for participation. Top awards will go to best Junior and Senior Model.

Sample Style Revue Contest Entry Narratives

Example 1: What to wear for dressy occasions won't be a problem for Mary Smith of the Dodge Clovers 4-H Club. She has purchased this blouse of poly rayon which features a double collar with black as the accent color. The hidden placket closure is also trimmed in black. Her long straight high waisted skirt of black ploy repeats the accents in her long sleeved blouse. To complete her look she wears a wide black leather belt and shoes. Mary will be a sophomore at Dodge City High School this fall. She enjoys swimming, softball and going out with her friends. Her favorite thing about the county fair is showing off her projects that she works hard on all year.

Example 2: Already for the fair is thirteen year old Matt Jones in his blue denim bib style outfit and flannel button up. Matt's bibs are accented by a Holstein cow appliqué in the corner. He completes his outfit with his trusty cowboy boots. A member of the Curious Clover 4-H Club and the Super Livestock 4-H Club, he has been in 4-H five years. This year his projects included rabbits, dairy, and creative costume.

Example 3: Leading cheers for F.S Middle School this year is twelve year old Chris in her blue and white top and pleated skirt. The 100% polyester fabric is easy care, withstands the activity of a cheerleader. Chris has personalized her outfit with her school emblem. Her accessories include white tennis shoes and hair scrunchie. She cannot wait to show off her school spirit this fall at school!
