

## Livestock Exhibitor Dress Code

Junior Fair Exhibitors Dress Code for all shows/programs/pictures and sale states the following:

1. Full-length pants are required, unless otherwise approved by the committee. Belts are strongly encouraged.
2. Closed toe shoes are required. (Hard soled shoes are recommended). No clogs or slides.
3. Shirts must have collars, sleeves, and be tucked in. No low cut tops. No halter-tops, tank tops, etc. will be allowed. Bare midriff and/or navel are not to show.
4. Anyone not in compliance with the dress code will be given a chance to change into an outfit that meets the above rules immediately prior to the show. If at any time during a show a member is not in compliance with the dress code he or she will be disqualified from both the show and the sale (if applicable.)

**Each department will enforce these rules with the backing of the Senior Fair Board. Exhibitors should wear appropriate clothes: picture day, show day, contest day, award program day, and sale day.**

## Jr. Fair Royalty Dress Code

While serving as a member of the Crawford County Junior Fair Royalty court the selected members are to abide by the following dress code rules.

- No crown/award/ or sash may be worn while any royalty member is showing or selling a project.
- Court members should **NOT** wear the following:
  - Shorts, leggings, mini-skirts, or ragged/ patched jeans
  - Low cut tops, tops exposing the midriff, tank tops or spaghetti strap shirts. No torn, cutoff shirts or shirts with sleeves cut out.
  - Royalty should not wear shirts with offensive logos or language.
  - Undergarments should **NOT** be exposed.
  - No open-toed shoes, or flip flops. Clean tennis shoes are permitted with docker-style pants.
- Recommended dress attire includes docker-style pants or jeans. Dresses are permitted as long as they **ARE APPROPRIATE** in length and style. It is suggested shirts have collars, sleeves, and be tucked in. A belt is strongly encouraged.

**THE DRESS REQUIREMENTS GO INTO EFFECT IMMEDIATELY FOLLOWING THE ROYALTY CONTEST.**

### **4-H Judging and Contest Dress Code**

Since judging is a learning experience of presentation of both yourself and your project, please keep in mind that clothing needs to be appropriate. Appropriate clothing for this judging and other non-livestock programs, contests and awards program will be:

- Nice jeans, docker style pants, capris, shorts, dresses or skirts longer than your finger tips at your sides. Shirts should have collars or dressy necklines. Shirts/tops may not have spaghetti straps, open sides or midriff showing. Shirts with offensive logos or language are not appropriate. Nice shoes even open toed shoes, flip flops, and nice tennis shoes are appropriate. Undergarments are not to be exposed.

### **Tips for 4-H Judging**

1. Be well groomed. That includes clean hands, hair, and fingernails.
2. Don't chew gum.
3. Use good posture. Sit and stand straight and tall.
4. Be polite and use your best manners.
5. Be prepared to talk about your project. Know what you did, how you did it, what you learned and what you might do differently the next time.
6. When answering the judge's questions, speak clearly and loudly enough for the judge to hear your answers.
7. During your interview, look directly at the judge. Give him/her your full attention. Don't be distracted by other people or noises around you.
8. Thank the judge when the interview is finished. Remember, the real purpose of judging is sharing and learning.
9. Be pleasant and confident. Smile and be enthusiastic!
10. Be proud of your accomplishments!! You worked hard to earn them.
