WHO Can Come to 4-H Camp?

Have a friend who isn't in 4-H? INVITE THEM! **Camp is open to ANY youth** who are at least 8 years old **AND** currently in third grade to youth in the eighth grade not older than 14.

WHERE is the 4-H Camp on Kelleys Island?

Kelleys Island 4-H Camp owned by Erie County 4-H is located on the north shore of Kelleys Island in Lake Erie. Campers venture across the lake on a ferry boat leaving from Marblehead and take a short bus ride to camp. Campers stay in one of 14 cabins with approximately 8-10 campers and trained counselors. Camp includes Swimming, Beach Front, Canoe/Kayaks, Nature Center, Craft Hall, Campfire Circle, Recreation Hall, Low Ropes Course, Sports Field, a Gaga Ball Pit, Basketball Court, Volleyball Courts, 9 square, and more.

How Much Will Camp COST?

The cost for camp is \$220.00. This cost includes **ferry boat to the island, bus ride to camp, meals, lodging, craft supplies, a camp t-shirt, and other various materials for the weekend.** *A family discount is available for families with more than one camper. \$10 off each camper (does not include counselors).*

Partial SCHOLARSHIP Information

Partial scholarships are available through the Crawford County 4-H Advisory Committee to those most deserving financial assistance (In the past scholarships have been a quarter or more of the camp fee).

A maximum 2 page story should be completed; 1 page by camper explaining why the camper wishes to attend & 1 page by adult (parent or guardian) explaining why a scholarship is needed. If more than one family member is applying, only 1 parent/ adult essay is needed. Content will be kept confidential.

Scholarship essays, along with completed camper registrations are due to OSU Extension **by 4:30 pm on Friday, May 29, 2026.** Selections will be made and families will be contacted by June 3rd. Payment for all scholarship applicants must be paid **by 4:30 pm on Friday, June 12, 2026.**

WHEN and HOW do I Register For Camp?

Registration will be due to the Extension Office by **Friday, May 29, 2026.** Campers will be accepted on a **first-come, first-served basis until camp is full.** *Waitlist will be started but spots not guaranteed.*

After you have returned the registration forms and payment to the OSU Extension office, you will receive additional information and health forms.

Additional camp packet will include checklist of what to bring, health forms to bring with you to the boat dock, and how to get to 4-H Camp Kelleys Island/ Kelleys Island boat dock on Marblehead. **It is your responsibility to find transportation to and from the Kelleys Island Boat Line; 510 W Main Street, Lakeside Marblehead Ohio 43440.** Registration at the dock will take place beginning at 10:00 a.m. on Friday, June 19th and campers will return to the dock around 11:30 a.m. on Monday, June 22nd. **Campers may not come to camp late or leave early-** contact Allison with questions.

HEALTH & SAFETY

Assuring the health & safety of each camper is important to us at 4-H Camp. There is a registered nurse on site and campers are covered by a health & safety policy throughout camp. Campers will receive an additional camp packet with health forms once they have registered and paid their camp fee; **PLEASE FILL FORMS OUT COMPLETELY AND HONESTLY!**

Cell Phone Policy Agreement

- **Campers are not allowed to bring cell phones or any other electronic devices to camp.**
- If a cell phone is brought to camp, it will be collected by a counselor at the first cabin meeting and turned into the camp director until the end of camp. If a camper is caught with a cell phone after that time, it is grounds for immediate dismissal.
- Counselors will turn in their cell phones to the camp director at the beginning of camp. If any phones are found throughout the weekend, the phone will be taken and the phone will NOT be returned until the end of camp. Counselor may also not be selected to come to camp the following year.
