General Guidelines:

- Topics for Individual and Team Demonstrations and Illustrated Talks will be included in the program.
 - Age divisions are: Junior, 8-13 years old, and Senior, 14 -19 years old, on January 1 of the current year.
 - Individuals may select any topic for his or her demonstration. No large animals or weapons permitted (includes arrow tips).
 - A demonstration, whether given by an individual or a team of two members should last between the following guidelines. Ages 8-11 presentations should be 6-9 minutes; Ages 12- 13 presentations should be 9-12 minutes; Ages 14 and up presentations should be 9-12 minutes.
 - If a contestant participates in both the Individual and Team Demonstration, they **MUST** present a different topic for each demonstration.
 - If a contestant is awarded State Fair participation opportunities in both the Junior Individual and Team Demonstration at the Ohio State Fair, the contestant **MUST** participate **ONLY** Team Demonstration at the Ohio State Fair.
 - Demonstrations and Illustrated Talks will be scored on originality, appearance, introduction, delivery, materials and conclusion.
 - Winners may represent Crawford County at the 4-H Communication Day at the Ohio State Fair, according to State Fair eligibility.
- ☐ Additional rules may be found in the 2015 Crawford County Junior Fair Book.
 - ☐ A copy of the score sheet to be used in judging can be obtained at the Extension Office.

2015 Junior Fair Favorite Food Contest

We will be using three judging areas for the contest for 2015. Your group has been assigned to either A or B or C judging areas. Please try and be at the Youth Building a few minutes early. We have allotted about 10 minutes per person in scheduling the contest. The kitchen will be available for your use (including the refrigerator, stoves, and microwave). The fair book lists the requirements for the contest. You will be directed where to set up when you arrive.

Participants must bring a favorite food (2 or more servings); one copy of recipe for judging and an additional copy of recipe used which will be kept at registration; a planned menu for the day which includes the favorite food (snacks are optional); one place setting for serving the menu which includes the food prepared; a serving spoon and a centerpiece. Participants will be interviewed for 5 to 6 minutes to evaluate their knowledge of the product and menu.

Participants are expected to set up by themselves, but family members will be allowed to help food and etc. into the judging area. There will be opportunities to taste the food following the classes. We will do our best to keep the judging schedule.

The categories and judging times for the "Make It With Lard" contest are as follows:

Sr. Division: Pies - one double crust fruit pie (no custard or cream pies). Bring entry and recipe by 9:15 a.m.

Jr. Division: Cookies – six cookies on a plate. Bring entry and recipe by 9:15 a.m.
