## 2016 Jr. Fair Livestock Exhibitor Reminders from the Crawford County Livestock Committee

### Swine Exhibitors:

- To prevent further stress on your hogs please make sure your hogs are accustomed to being washed before coming to fair.
- Please have your DUNF forms filled out before coming into fair grounds
- Upon arrival for weigh in, all barrows and gilts MUST have a measurable one half inch ( 1/2") of body hair, underline included. The hair on the ears and tail may be a shorter length. Market hogs not meeting this requirement will not be admitted for show. A one half inch ( 1/2") trimmer guard will actually cut hair shorter than a 1/2".

### Dairy Feeder Exhibitors:

- **New this year:**
  - Exhibitors will have the option of using show sticks; show sticks ARE OPTIONAL and will not be required this year!
  - Show sticks MAY be used during the regular dairy feeder show. They MAY NOT be used in showmanship.

### Beef Feeder Exhibitors:

- Reminder: Tag in day is June 11<sup>th</sup>. Committee will come to your home to tag.

### Poultry Exhibitors:

- Reminder: Broiler hatch week is the week of June 6<sup>th</sup>

**Crawford County Livestock Skillathon will be held in the Jr. Fair Arena on Saturday, July 9<sup>th</sup> from 8:30- 10:30 a.m.**

Livestock Skillathon is required for all 4-H youth to complete their project.

**Study Kits are available for any youth to sign out of the OSU Extension Office. They are available on a first come, first serve basis and will only be available until July 1<sup>st</sup>!**

If you cannot attend the countywide skillathon, make up arrangements must be made prior to skillathon with your livestock department and approved by the 4-H Educator.

  - Don't forget to include a picture of yourself.
  - Do not wait until the last minute to get an advisor to give you a recommendation.

## Drug Use Notification Forms:

Available for club advisors to pick up and distribute to livestock exhibitors.

All Jr. Fair livestock exhibitors must turn in a DUNF for each animal. This applies to beef, dairy, dairy beef, alpaca/llama, hogs, sheep, goats, rabbits (1 form per pen), and poultry (1 form per pen).

State Fair will only accept one advanced food level project entry per project for State Fair.

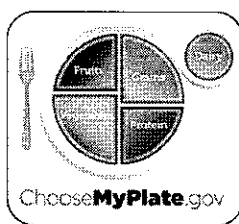

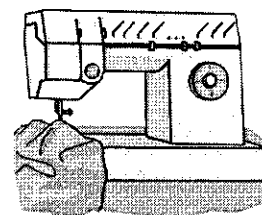
